
Holiday Updale

Your Support is Helping this Family Thrive

The Greeley Transitional House exists solely to help struggling families regain their stability, find hope and support, and to eventually achieve self-sufficiency. Thanks to your support, Gloria and her family are well on their way to becoming completely stable.

Prior to joining our program Gloria was a two time cancer survivor, and had just recently endured the death of her husband. She arrived at GTH very broken and in need of support and hope. She stayed at GTH for about three months and then was enrolled in our two-year follow-up transitional housing program.

For the past two years she has worked diligently to complete a series of goals, despite suffering another debilitating illness shortly after leaving the shelter



which has left her with speech and mobility problems. With the program's support she has obtained her GED and is enrolled at Aims pursing an Associates of Applied Science Degree with an emphasis in engineering. She has been raising her family and going to school with only the bus system for transportation.....a process made even more difficult by her limited mobility. However, Gloria recently obtained her driver's license and purchased a vehicle so

that she can now drive her children and herself to school. Gloria will be completing her work with GTH in January, and is proud to be moving into her own modest home and will continue to pursue her education.

We are extremely proud of Gloria's strength, courage and determination to keep her family together and to provide them with the basic foundation they will need to thrive into adulthood. We are also grateful that the GTH program exists to help families like Gloria's build a better future.

The Greeley Transitional House has completed another successful year thanks to the support of our wonderful donors and community partners. With your support here's what we accomplished in 2013:

- * 80 families received emergency shelter
- * 145 children were kept safe and housed
- * 76 families received continued support through our transitional housing programs
- * 463 individuals were

- supported by one of our programs.
- * 156 homeless families were housed
- * 29 families "graduated" our follow-up program and were successfully working and living in homes again.

Camfield Corners Apartments Expanding

In 2012 GTH began offering transitional housing apartments at the Camfield Corner Apts. on 3rd Street & 11th Ave. in Greelev.

We manage these apartments on behalf of the City of Greeley's Urban Renewal Authority through a long-term lease/partnership. There are currently eight apartments at the site and this fall GURA began construction on a triplex to add three additional two and three bedroom units. The units will be completed by spring 2014.

Over the past two years we have been able to assist 14 families in this two-year transitional housing which includes monthly case management support. Our goal with these units is to help families moving from the shelter to re-



build their credit and housing histories before moving on to permanent housing in the commu-

nity. We are very grateful to the GURA Board and Staff for giving us this opportunity to provide further support for homeless families.
